**RON SCHARA PRODUCTIONS TO PRODUCE ADDITIONAL MONSTERQUEST EPISODES FOR THE HISTORY CHANNEL**

(Minneapolis, MN) Ron Schara Productions, an award-winning television production company, has renewed two more “MonsterQuest” shows for The History Channel.

“We’re gearing up for the productions currently,” says Jared Christie, Executive Producer of the segments, “We are planning a Baja trip the end of September to film Megalodon, and also a filming in Japan in December for giant jellyfish.”

The hugely popular MonsterQuest series, which has aired on The History Channel since October 31<sup>st</sup>, 2007, is gearing up for another slate of monsters. The crew has traveled the world in search of the monsters, including Australia, Sumatra and China.

MonsterQuest is a documentary television series that began to air last year on The History Channel and has found a loyal following of viewers. From Bigfoot to Swamp Beast, Monsterquest reveals the truth of legendary monster sightings from around the world. Deploying the latest in hi-tech equipment, each episode scientifically examines the best evidence available, from pictures and video, to hair and bones, as well as the eyewitness accounts themselves. One part history, one part science and one part monsters, MonsterQuest discovers the truth behind these legendary monsters.
